




Provost Perspectives A newsletter from the Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs

UBHE passes resolution on neutrality

Last week the Utah Board of Higher Education adopted a resolution establishing expectations for implementing principles of free speech on campus. The resolution calls on institutions in the Utah System of Higher Education to maintain institutional neutrality, protect a speaker's right to free expression and establish a program to educate students about free speech. An advisory committee will be established by the Office of the Commissioner to help develop solutions, policies and procedures moving forward.
