Stegner Center launches Great Salt Lake project

The S.J. Quinney College of Law and the Wallace Stegner Center have launched a new project to provide legal analysis on the environmental challenges facing the Great Salt Lake. The GSL Project published its inaugural report that discusses legal risks relating to the lake's decline.

Fang Lab forges \$10M agreement with IperionX

Metallurgical Engineering professors Z. Zak Fang and Pei Sun in the U's <u>Department of Materials Science and Engineering</u> recently signed a research agreement with <u>IperionX (IPX)</u> for \$10M over 10 years, effective January 1. Fang and his research team will provide IPX with research and development services to produce primary metals, advanced manufacturing technologies, and recycling of rare earth metals from magnets used in wind turbines and electric vehicles.
