Welcome to fall semester! I hope you had a productive and restful summer. It's exciting to begin a new academic year. I hope you will join me in welcoming new faces to our campus and offer support where it is needed.

We expect that free speech activities and academic freedom will be active on campus this year. As a reminder, the U supports thoughtful and respectful discourse, but it also has an obligation to ensure the safety, security, and function of our campus, which is to provide education and instruction. In addition, the Office for Faculty has prepared a helpful <a href="guide">guide</a> for faculty support in relation to academic freedom, classroom management and public engagement. We begin this year with some notable <u>changes</u> in response to HB 261. Read an FAQ about HB 261 guidance for students <u>here</u>. On July 1, staff from the Black Cultural Center, Center for Equity and Student Belonging, LGBT Resource Center and Women's Resource Center were reassigned and the Center for Community and Cultural Engagement and Center for Student Access and Resources were created. As I noted in my <u>newsletter</u> in June, while this is not the path that we would have chosen, we are committed to

continuing to serve our students and providing them the support that they need to succeed. According to HB 261 and guidance from USHE, the U can apply for new centers that focus on cultural education, celebration, engagement and awareness, and we hope to pursue that path. As we work through these changes and applications, we will strengthen our community by extending dignity, respect and understanding to each other. The U is committed to fostering a campus environment that welcomes everyone, and where all students, faculty and staff can thrive.

Finally, with football season at our doorstep, we look forward to welcoming visitors and fans to our campus. Our home opener against Southern Utah University is Thursday, Aug. 29 at 7 p.m. This will impact parking as several lots on campus will be closed all day. Alternative parking will be available at Stillman Field. Please see this <u>map</u> for more details. If your class will be significantly impacted by the parking or transportation constraints, you have the flexibility to consider alternative instruction models or work with your supervisor to consider alternative work arrangements.
